

Dr. LaFleur is the E. Dale Saunders Professor in Japanese Studies at the Department of East Asian Languages and Civilizations, University of Pennsylvania and a Senior Fellow at Penn's Center for Bioethics. Much of his work deals with comparisons between Japan and the United States—especially in the areas of religion, public philosophy, and social ethics. Among his books are *The Karma of Words: Buddhism and the Literary Arts in Medieval Japan*; *Liquid Life: Abortion and Buddhism in Japan*; and *Buddhism: A Cultural Perspective*. In 1989 he was the first non-Japanese to be awarded the Watsuji Tetsurô Culture Prize. Most recently, he has been the principal editor of *Dark Medicine: Rationalizing Unethical Medical Research*. His books have been published in Japanese, Russian and German.
